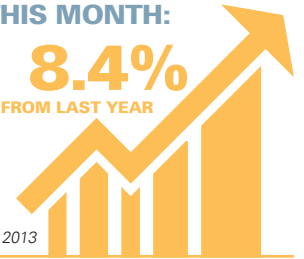

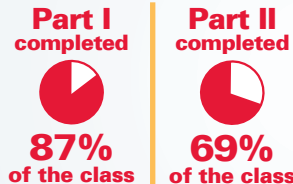

Prevention Services

The Prevention Services department provides campus-wide leadership for a comprehensive approach to reduce health risks for students. In collaboration with our campus and community partners, we strive to foster a healthy campus environment and support the academic success of our students.

Health issues that are focused on include high-risk drinking and sexual and interpersonal violence. We use the environmental management approach and the 3-in-1 Framework to inform our decisions and guide our efforts for maximum impact.

Part of the environmental management strategy is to provide the AlcoholEdu & Haven online education for new, direct from high school, students. This year:



- **Part 1** contains both alcohol and sexual misconduct education (2-hr program).
- **Part 2** is a 15-minute follow-up after students have been on campus a few weeks (open Sept. 16th - Oct. 4th, with reminder email messages continuing through this week).

The surveys provide great information about how student behaviors change from before coming to campus to after they've been here for a few weeks.

In addition, we provide awareness activities for groups known to be at higher risk for engaging in problem behaviors. Three alcohol presentations and seven MVP presentations are scheduled within the next two months.

Condom Distribution is the most effective prevention strategy for sexual health for our population.

Condoms are distributed at Free Condom Wednesdays & Thursdays, the student health medical clinic, residence hall desks, community advisors, fraternities and sororities. 38,050 condoms have been distributed since Aug. 16th.

We believe that strong community and campus partnerships are a very effective ways to manage campus environmental change through policy and partnerships. We participated in the community collaborations such as the Story County Prevention Policy Board, Campustown Action Association, Healthiest Ames committee and specific collaborations with groups such as Campustown Property Management and the Ames Police Safe Neighborhoods program.

In addition, we collaborate on campus committees such as the SVPSA Community Development Committee, SVPSA Student Success Committee and Sexual Misconduct student programming committee. We work specifically with ISU Police Outreach and both the alcohol prevention leadership group and Mentors in Violence prevention leadership group.

Prevention Services is working hard to communicate ways to make a #SaferState, including a recent interview on Iowa Public Radio about high-risk drinking on college campuses and responding to editorials regarding high-risk drinking and sexual misconduct topics.
