Odyssey of the Mind is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities for students. Team members bring their creativity to the world finals in Ames each summer.

Similar to the healthcare services provided during Special Olympics, Student Health is available to meet the medical needs of the Odyssey of the Mind teams while they are on campus.

From coordinating care for chronic healthcare needs, arranging for special medical equipment to be available, and treating numerous acute injuries and common ailments, the clinic stays very busy during Odyssey of the Mind.

This year, a coach for a team from Arkansas, needed her peritoneal dialysis supplies shipped before she arrived. Greg Yeakel, chief staff pharmacist, coordinated with her in advance and personally delivered the shipment to her in the residence hall when they arrived.
